We have recently dealt with a situation where an inappropriately named social media account was created. The creator of this account then tried to follow a number of our students. We have spoken to all of the students concerned and I am pleased to say that they were all disgusted by the name of the account and have blocked it and reported it which will result in the account being removed. This account contained no inappropriate images but that does not detract from the fact that the use of social media for anything other than sensible communication between friends is not acceptable. Setting up such accounts also has a detrimental effect on the reputation of The Lakes School.


