

## Pupil Premium Impact Report 2012-2013

The data below represents a significant step forward in outcomes for Pupil Premium students at The Lakes School. The gap in achievement between Pupil Premium students and non-Pupil Premium students for 2013 is the smallest it has been since the introduction of the funding to support Pupil Premium students.

**The Lakes School is closing the gap between the achievement of Pupil Premium and non-Pupil Premium students, as shown in Table 1 below.**

At The Lakes School we are proud of the improvement in outcomes we have secured for Pupil Premium students. The information below provides an overview of how we have brought about these improvements and a summary of the outcomes of Pupil Premium and Non-Pupil Premium students in relation to national averages.

We recognise that there is still scope for improvement and will be working tirelessly to ensure remove barriers to learning that may prevent students from achieving their best.

### What have we done to support pupil premium students this year?

Throughout the year 2012-2013 we have used our Pupil Premium funding in the following ways:

1. To provide extra staffing for Maths and English to provide extra support for students to help them achieve their target grades.
2. To provide revision guides and access to revision materials for students who need support with their learning.
3. To support student with the costs of music tuition – recognising that achievement and success in areas outside academic study can help students achieve in other areas of their school life.
4. To support students with the costs of educational visits to support their learning.
