The feedback gathered from pupils, parents and staff members confirms that we made an excellent start!

- Our **lunchtime talks from local employers** gave pupils first-hand exposure to various careers, sparking interest, offering insights, and motivating them to envision their future career paths.

 future.
- Our assemblies from local colleges introduced pupils to higher education possibilities, inspiring future educational aspirations and career goals, providing valuable insights for their future planning.
- Our **Work Experience** programme for Year 10 allowed pupils to gain real-world insights, enabling them to make informed decisions and plan for their future with confidence.

PUPIL FEEDBACK

The Careers Programme for 2022-23 was overwhelmingly positively received by pupils and, more importantly, viewed as a **valuable and worthwhile** experience by them.

In July, we conducted a survey using Microsoft Forms (see below for the full results) and here are some of the key takeaways from that survey:

88% considered our Careers Programme to have been a 'meaningful experience'

86% considered our Careers Fair to have been 'useful and informative'

76% considered our Careers Week activities to have been 'useful and informative'

75% considered our **Emails Home** to have been 'clear and informative'

67% considered our Lunchtime Talks to have been 'interesting and informative'



PARENT FEEDBACK

Again, the Careers Programme for 2022-23 was overwhelmingly positively received with parents keen to express their approval of the opportunities that had been provided.

In July, we conducted a survey using Microsoft Forms (see below for the full results) and here are some of the key takeaways from that survey:

In July, we conducted a survey using Microsoft Forms (see below for the full results) and here are some of the key takeaways from that survey:





4. CAREERS TALKS AT LUNCHTIME: Which of the following lunchtime talks did you attend? (Please tick all that apply)




5. CAREERS TALKS AT LUNCHTIME: Did you find the talks you attended to be interesting and informative?







1. LUNCHTIME TALKS: Which of the following lunchtime talks were you aware of us hosting this year? (Please tick all that apply)




3. NATIONAL CAREERS WEEK IN MARCH: Did you find the websites Mr Pickering directed you towards on a nightly basis to be useful and informative?









Should you require any assistance I would be more than happy to provide further information. Even just as important I would be pleased to offer my time to the school to provide coaching in terms of getting potential candidates through the early interview process.
